Kerala has a wide network of Co-operatives engaged in various promotional activities, particularly in agricultural credit and banking, public distribution system, distribution of agricultural commodities, marketing, agro processing, consumer activities, public health, education, housing, insurance and infrastructure development, scheduled caste and scheduled tribes development, women development etc. and have

recorded an impressive progress in serving people belonging to various economic backgrounds. More than 16,000 societies are functioning under the control of the Registrar of Cooperative Societies (RCS).

Besides, more than 7000 Co-operative societies in various sectors such as Industrial, Dairy, Fisheries, Handloom, Coir etc. are functioning in the State under the control of other functional Registrars.

Taking all these into account, Kochi has been selected as the venue of Co-operative Expo-2022.


Expo Location Map


